New Halifax RC Park

If you are a remote control car enthusiast then you'll want to check out the new Halifax RC Park located in Beaver Bank.

This park has been in the making for over a year and can now be enjoyed at the Beaver Bank ball field behind the skate park. It has a nicely laid out 650-foot track with borders made from recycled plastic piping. This piping originally ran along the top of the fences in the park. Now new yellow piping has been installed along the top of the fences surrounding the baseball diamonds

which gives the park a fresh look.

According to their website the Halifax Radio Control Park Committee is a "not for profit" organization run entirely by volunteers from in and around the Halifax area. They are a collection of local RC club members and enthusiasts who share a common goal: to build and maintain a public RC park for the community at large through public and private donations and sponsorships. It is not a club therefore no membership dues or

usage fees. However they ask that people respect the rules which are posted as well as all bylaws and use common sense when using the facility.

Great things happening in the office!

The speed sign is currently being tested in a location at 1583
Beaver Bank Road and should soon be available, by request, in areas that require monitoring.
Call 864-6072 (correct phone number) to be put on the waiting list or to volunteer to assist with temporary speeds sign installation at other sites.

We have three volunteers who have Commissioner of Oaths status so, if you have forms which require a Commissioner signature, call 864-1035 or 864-1533 and ask for Ken Meisner, Russ Hennigar or May Renfrew.

Vial of Life packages are available free from this office. It is a good idea to complete relevant family and medical details, pop the vial in the fridge and keep updated for use in case of emergency.

For years we have offered a "buddy system" volunteer phone call service. If you would like to be called to chat on a regular basis let us know and we will arrange convenient times.

The City Watch system is still active. If you have not already signed on and wish to do so either call this office or register online at www.beaverbank.ca (see ad in Bulletin).

The Future: we would, once again, like to open the office five

days a week from 9am until 9pm. To do this we require more volunteers (all age groups over 18 yrs). Duties are varied according to capabilities and desire of the individual but could include phoning, data entry for City Watch and updating the Website, Buddy system chats, involvement with the speed sign setting up and monitoring, giving street directions and interacting with visitors to the Centre (which is becoming a busy spot!). If you could spare 3-4 hours weekly we would love to talk to you. No particular skills are required. Note: Volunteering hours recorded on a résumé really count when applying for University or a new job.



I hope everyone enjoyed our beautiful Nova Scotia summer and had the opportunity to explore and enjoy our lovely province. There are still many events and beautiful parts of the Province to visit during the fall. Our busy students are set to head back to school for another year with many attending for the first time as well as many moving on to new schools. There is a late registration opportunity taking place on August 26th and the first day of school is Wednesday, September 3rd. The HRSB has marked September 11th as "Stand up Against Bullying Day - Wear Pink". Best wishes to all on a successful and safe school year.

Accessing Government Services with 10-Digit Dialing

Three-digit numbers used for emergencies and other services will not be affected by the change to 10-digit dialing that comes into effect Saturday, August 23rd.

Callers will not need to dial 1 or the area code to access 211 (Community and Social Services-Provincial), 311 (Services and Information-Halifax), 511 (Road Conditions-Highways) 811 (Nurse Line) or 911 (Emergency).

Calls to toll-free phone lines will also be unaffected. Contact information for government programs and services is staying the same but callers will need to dial the area code after August 23rd.

Government Invests in Seniors Social Housing

A new federal-provincial housing agreement will provide seniors, families and persons with disabilities with more access to an affordable place to call home.

The governments of Nova Scotia and Canada announced an additional combined investment of 102-million dollars over five years to help more people find affordable housing. It is an extension to the Investment in Affordable Housing agreement.

Community Services Minister Joanne Bernard, who is responsible for Housing Nova Scotia, says too many families and seniors still need affordable housing and this will help. The extension runs to 2019. The original agreement helped more than 183,600 households nationally, and about 7,400 in Nova Scotia.

MSI Coverage Extended for Out of Province Travel

Planning a long vacation outside the province this year? We've got good news. Starting August 1st, Nova Scotians can travel out of the province for a total of seven months per year without losing their MSI coverage.

Anyone who uses provincial Pharmacare programs will also be able to get up to three 90-day refills of their medications before they leave.

Vacationers planning a long trip

will have to let MSI know in advance. About 900 Nova Scotians register temporary absences with MSI each year.

Eastlink TV carries Legislative Television programming each Tuesday, Noon - 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, 2:00 - 5:00 p.m. and Thursday, Noon - 4:00 p.m., when the Legislature is sitting.

News and Views

Access to Employment Insurance at all-time low

Access to Employment Insurance (EI) is at an all-time low with less than 40% of unemployed Canadians eligible to receive benefits. A recent Statistics Canada study also shows that 12,000 fewer people received El benefits in the month of May—the largest drop in nearly two years. There is no doubt that we are seeing the impact of the federal government's cuts to the EI program. Reductions in the number of public service employees who administer claims have led to lengthy wait times for unemployed workers. It typically takes thirty business days for the federal government to process a normal El claim and it can take another thirty business days to process any change to an original claim. This is a long wait for individuals who have lost their jobs and are in need of temporary financial assistance until they find new employment. Canadians who find themselves in a situation of temporary unemployment deserve to have access to the insurance benefits they paid into. The NDP continue to push for a reversal of these cuts. My colleague Robert Chisholm (Dartmouth-Cole Harbour) has tabled a bill that would protect workers' contributions to the EI fund and prevent the federal government from dipping into the EI account for any other use. The Employment Insurance program must be there when Canadians need it.

Ottawa must do more to help soldiers and veterans with PTSD

The rates of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) among members of the Canadian Forces continue to rise according to a recent report by Statistics Canada. The Canadian Forces Mental Health Survey 2013 interviewed approximately 6,700 current full-time members to assess

whether they had experienced depression, PTSD, anxiety, panic, alcohol abuse, and alcohol dependence within the previous year. Figures from the study indicate that approximately one in six Canadian Forces members experienced one of these mental health problems.

These findings are alarming. The government must take urgent action to reduce the number of Canadian Forces and RCMP members experiencing mental health concerns.

Government Needs to Cancel Plans for Parking Fees at Military Bases

Military personnel are upset with the decision by DND to charge for parking at CFB Halifax starting September 1st. CFB Halifax will be the first base in Canada to charge for parking. Fees will be levied for parking at six sites including the HMC Dockyard, Stadacona, Halifax Armoury, and Dartmouth Dockyard. DND also plans to oversell the spots by approximately 1,000 passes meaning paying members are not guaranteed a spot. The change in parking fees will also apply to civilians and volunteers with the Military Family Resource Centre. DND says the new fee based parking policy stems from a Treasury Board and Canada Revenue Agency decision that determined that employee parking is a taxable benefit.

This issue first came to my attention three years ago. In a letter to the Minister of National Defence, I asked him to cancel the new fee based parking policy at bases across the country. CF members should not have to pay for parking considering they face multiple deployments, frequent moves, long hours without overtime pay, and many occupational risks. It is an example of how the current government says they support the troops but then nickel and dime them for benefits like employee parking. We urge the Conservative government to put a stop to plans to charge parking fees at military bases.

Situation in Middle East and Eastern Europe

Canadians are very concerned with the ongoing crisis in the Middle East. Many of you have also contacted me about the situation in the Ukraine and the growing violence in Iraq. As these situations continue to evolve, New Democrats will continue to push for Canada to pursue opportunities for diplomatic resolution and urge all sides to strive for mutual understanding and lasting peace.

Safety tips for Halloween

Halloween is almost here...

Motorists are asked to use extra caution, particularly in residential areas, and children are encouraged to follow these recommended safety rules:

- Dress in a brightly coloured costume. Carry a flashlight and stay close to well-lit areas.
- Go trick-or-treating with at least one other trick-or-treater, or a responsible adult.
- For older children, discuss your route with your parents before you leave and make sure they know what time you'll be home.
- Try to limit criss-crossing the street. Go down one side of the street and up the other to limit the number of times you cross.
- Never enter a stranger's home or car for a treat.
 Stay on the doorstep or sidewalk while trick-ortreating.
- Have mom or dad check your treats before digging in
 - Remember to dress warmly and have fun!

Homeowners can also make trick-or-treaters feel safe:

- Keep porch lights or external security lights on.
- Keep doors clear and accessible. Avoid decorating entrances with flammable material and ensure decorations don't pose a tripping hazard.
 - · Don't invite children inside your home.
 - Only give out commercially wrapped candy and snacks.
 - Call police immediately if you spot suspicious activity.
 - Keep the pets indoors as they may be easily scared by children in costumes.
