

Update from Station 48 – Tis the winter season

Your fire department continues to be busy training, fire prevention activities, and responding to calls within our community. Since the last update, we have responded to 25 calls; 9 medical assists, 5 alarms activated, 3 investigations, 3 mutual aid structure fires, 1 structure fire in our response area, 1 brush fire, 1 vehicle fire, and 1 special service call. This brings our total to 144 responses for assistance as I write this update.

With snowflakes flying around and colder temperatures here to stay. the winter season is finally upon us. Here are a few safety tips from your friendly neighborhood firefighters that will hopefully help prevent a call for us to visit you. Driving Habits - Our road conditions can change quickly with the winter weather. Black ice, snow covered roads, and longer hours of darkness during our regular commute are a real concern. Some suggestions are the use of appropriate winter tires, a roadside emergency kit, a blanket, and a good snowbrush to keep your windshield and windows clear of that dirty ice and snow. The main tip is to drive for the conditions showing, slow and steady will always get you safely home. If you don't have to be on the roads, then relax at home.

Ice Safety - With the temperatures dropping, the ponds will start to freeze over and turn to ice covered playgrounds for everyone. Before you venture out on the ice, have a responsible person check the thickness of the ice. Some of our ponds in the area (Barrett Lake & Tucker Lake) have the ice thickness measured by HRM. You can check out the HRM website for these Ice Thickness Reports and safety notes about activities on frozen ponds and lakes. As a general guide - a person skating alone on ice requires 15 cm of ice thickness. For a skating party or group - 20 cm. For a snowmobile or ATV - 25 cm of ice thickness is recommended.

January and February will continue to be busy months for the volunteers of your fire department. Besides the regular training and call outs for emergencies, the Fire Department will be taking some extra refresher training to keep our members up to date and current in our skills. We would like to thank everyone for helping us "Fill our Port-A-Tank for the Food Banks" again this year. We will be accepting donations at the station on Tuesday nights or you can stop by and make a donation at Breakfast with Santa or the Tinsel the Talking Tree events being held at the Community Center.

As well, we would like send out our appreciation to those that donated or participated with our Fire Department Association Turkey Bingo.

On another note, as most everyone is aware by now, the new bus route will be terminating at the Fire Station / Community Center. This is a friendly reminder that the fire department parking lot is for fire department use and not a park and ride. We ask that the parking lot be kept clear and free for firefighters so that they can safely park at the station when we are called upon to respond to an emergency within the community.

On behalf of the members, I would like to thank the community for your support in 2019 and we wish everyone a safe and prosperous 2020.

We have had a busy summer doing trail work and club activities, we completed another successful project on our 5k trail and we are continuing to work in that trail! There is lots of work to do as we continue to work toward getting into the center of the trail to fix the worst spots. We are working with the government to get the three bridges replaced in the 5k trail and will be applying for that funding through the Off-Highway Vehicle Infrastructure Fund (OHVIF) in 2020 to complete the work in 2021. In the meantime, we will continue to work toward finishing the surface of the trail.

The owners of Beaver Bank Children's Learning Centre, Cheryl Leadlay and Marina Johnson did not know one another prior to starting the business. "We were the only two people who came to view the space. Once we started talking about our ideas we knew we shared a similar vision for childcare in Beaver Bank." Beaver Bank Children's Learning Centre opened its doors in September 2004 in the Beaver Bank Kinsac



Community Centre (pre-fire).

When they started they had six pre-school children and six school age children with Cheryl and Marina being the two educators. The biggest challenge faced was the Community Centre fire in 2009. This fire devastated the entire community and displaced so many groups and people. They were fortunate that their 95 Kinsac location was near completion and would be ready by February 2010. The outpouring of community support was overwhelming. Friends, educators, businesses and complete strangers arrived with donations of time, toys, books, furniture and wine when needed! Beaver Bank Kinsac Elementary gave space for our school group at the school. The management and staff at lvy Meadows opened their hearts and gave up their lunchroom for them to continue their part day preschool program. To this day the children and educators have enjoyed a close relationship with the staff and the wonderful people who live at Ivy Meadows. The children visit regularly with the educators taking them by bus on a weekly basis. This sadly will come to an end in November with the bus not having North Beaver Bank on its route.

Over the years they have grown to serve more than four hundred families. Currently they employ seventeen early childhood

educators and one amazing cook! Cheryl and Marina attribute the longevity of Beaver Bank Children's Learning Centre to the relationships they have built and maintain with the children and families in their



care. In order for this to happen they believe that having long term, dedicated and loyal educators is fundamental.

Cheryl and Marina want to thank the community of Beaver Bank for their support and would be remiss if they did not send out a sincere thank you to the Beaver Bank Kinsac Community Centre Board- past and present for their encouragement and support over the past fifteen years. They look forward to providing childcare for many years to come!


Award Encourages Young Innovators – Grades Six to Twelve

Public school students in grades six to 12 across the province will have an opportunity to bring their business ideas to life. The Minister's Entrepreneurship Award of Excellence will provide three students with mentorship and \$1,000 each to launch their ideas. Since the award was launched in 2018, more than 40 students with 35 ideas have participated. The three winner categories are Social Enterprise, Technology and Innovation/Creativity. Improved Safety for Nova Scotians Living with a Brain Injury

Nova Scotians living with brain injuries deserve to feel safe and independent. The province is expanding the personal alert assistance program to support more people in their homes. The province is investing \$54,720 over the next three years to help low-income Nova Scotians.

19 years or older, who are diagnosed with an acquired brain injury, to access personal alert devices. These devices connect the user to 911 with the push of a button in an emergency situation. Those who qualify for the assistance program will receive \$480 a vear to cover the cost of the personal alert device.
