BBCAA Town Hall Initiatives

The BBCAA Town Hall is Wednesday 17 May. All are welcome. The following will discuss 3 new initiatives that will be presented at the meeting.

The wind turbines have been generating power since March 2015. The community, through the BBCAA receives 1% of revenue for distribution to worthy causes as 1/3 to each of social programs, short term capital projects, and multi-year projects. Applications can be found on BeaverBank.ca for the first two initiatives. For the multi-year projects, if you have a project in mind, consider joining our board to promote your views.



On another front, two of our board members have joined the HRM Crime Prevention Association (CPA) board in an effort to expand the effectiveness of our



Community Policing Office. The HRM CPA has determined that their focus for 2017 will be on Fraud Awareness and Education for Seniors. A recent National Report "Into the Light: on the Mistreatment of Older Canadians 2015 estimates almost 250,000 elderly Canadians have been financially abused. Education and Awareness are key to fraud prevention. In 2017, the CPA will be contacting various seniors group to offer Educational Presentations on Fraud Awareness, Education and Prevention throughout HRM. Next up will be youth, as we try to resurrect the very popular D.A.R.E program. Tell us what you think.

The BBCAA Capsite Committee has begun a project to equip the community with aerial drone capability through its mandate to foster a better understanding of technology. At the Town Hall we will be asking the public for volunteer pilots to learn and promote this technology. It is anticipated that 4 pilots will be required, 1 of which will be asked to lead the project and direct drone operations. Applicants, 35 years and older with their own transportation, and some experience would be preferred.

If you would like to express an interest in becoming one of our pilots, please email allenclay@bellaliant.net. Here is the catch: you must be available from time to time if needed by the community for local events or emergencies.



A new phase for community information will be announced at the Town Hall, The opening of the Facebook page called "The Beaver Bank Advocate" will cover all things Beaver Bank in the way of Provincial and Municipal projects and development throughout the whole community from the Bypass through parks and schools. BBCAA board member Elmer Grove will be spearheading this initiative



Beaver Bank Kinsac Virtual Museum Now Online

The BBKAA is happy to announce a collaboration between ourselves (BBKAA and C@P Site), the Fultz House Museum and the Beaver Bank Community Office to bring the history of Beaver Bank & Kinsac online. The goal is to showcase historical pictures from our area and preserve and share these images. The website has gone live at:

We are very pleased that the Fultz House Museum is allowing us access to their collection specific to Beaver Bank Kinsac. The Beaver Bank Community Office is keen to start the process of digitizing pictures.

The first step began last summer and fall. The C@P site had a summer student

indexing and scanning part of a collection housed at Fultz House. Photographs and other papers were donated to Fultz House by Mary Kelly a descendant of the Hallisey family. The Hallisey family lived and ran the Railway Station at the corner of Windgate and Beaver Bank Rd. Some of these images are posted to the website. This will be an ongoing project.

The second component is to collect as much information as possible about all the men listed on the War Memorial at Kinsac Corner. We hope to get a collection of information loaded to the website by July 1st or for the next Remembrance Day. The list of names on the Memorial is on the website. 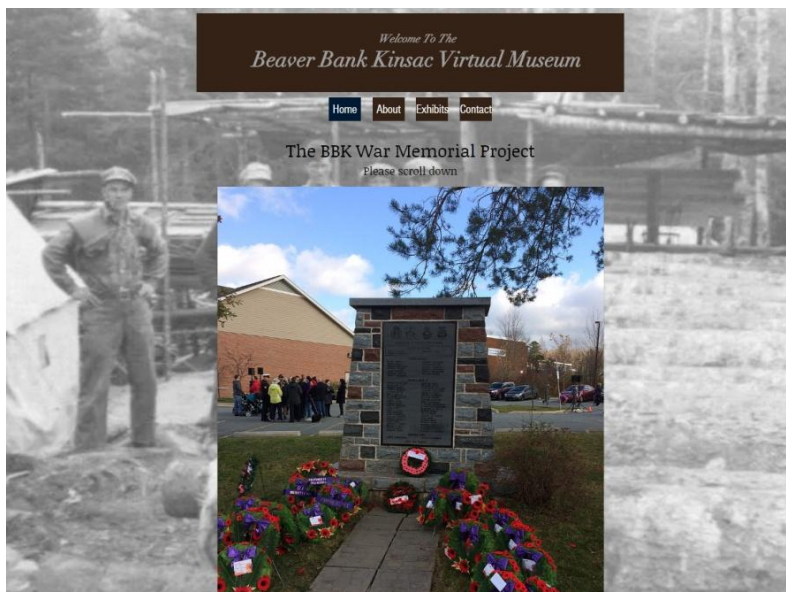

Update from Station 48

Spring is almost here and so is the open air burning season

It has been a while since we could provide an update from our department but the members of the Beaver Bank – Kinsac Volunteer Fire Department continue to keep busy with training, responding to emergencies and fire prevention activities in the community as 2017 hasn't slowed down at all.

With so much to catch up on, we will begin with the total number of calls ending the year of 2016. For 2016 we responded to 145 calls for assistance which is a higher volume of calls than we normally get. As our community continues to grow with new home construction and an increase in people calling the area home, the department expects to see our number of calls increase as we move forward.

Since the beginning of 2017, at the time of submission to the bulletin, the department has responded to 27 pages for assistance; 15 medical assists, 5 alarms activated, 2 structure fires, 2 calls of trees on power lines, 2 motor vehicle accidents, and 1 illegal burn. Looks like it is going to be another busy year for the fire department.

One topic that everyone likes to talk about is the weather and for the first

three months of 2017, we definitely have seen our share. With wind, rain, snow and changing temperatures, it is hard to know what to wear when heading out the door in the morning. First off, I would like to thank those who adopted a fire hydrant these past few snow events and kept them clear of snow. Thankfully we were never in a position to have to use one for a fire emergency but having them kept clear can save precious moments when it comes to putting out a fire. Members of the department were out as well, clearing away key hydrants in case we needed them.

With the fluctuating temperatures, we would like to remind everyone that the ice in the ponds and lakes may not be safe to be on. Always check the thickness before you go. At this time of the year we would encourage everyone to stay off the ice as we have had some significant swings in temperatures mostly on the warm side.

By the time the bulletin is published, we will be into the official open air burning season for 2017 within the province as determined by the Department of Natural Resources. Your fire department would like to thank everyone for burning responsibly last summer but

we would like to remind everyone of the responsibilities of burning within our beautiful community. There are two sets of regulations with respect to open air burning, Provincial regulations issued by the Department of Natural Resources; and the municipal HRM Open Air Burning By-Law. Homeowners must still adhere to the provincial rules and follow the local by-laws. The general rule is that if you live on a street serviced with both municipal water and sewer, you are not allowed to burn. If you are on a street that is not serviced with both municipal water and municipal sewer, you can burn as long as you follow the rules. It is important for those who burn to know that there is no burning from midnight until 2 PM. At 2 PM you must check the DNR website and if it is GREEN, you can burn from 2 PM until midnight. If it is YELLOW, you can burn from 7 PM until midnight. If it is RED, no burning permitted which includes campfires. Under extreme conditions at any time, DNR or the municipality can implement a ban on burning. If you are unsure if you can or cannot burn, please visit the fire station on a Tuesday night between 7PM and 8 PM and we will be happy to

answer your questions.

As members of the fire department we respond to calls for assistance when our pager goes off whether it is 2 in the afternoon or 2 in the morning. The dedicated men and women of the Beaver Bank – Kinsac Volunteer Fire Department for the past 52 years have continued to help out in the community when our friends, neighbors and even family have called for help. In the true tradition of helping within our community, this past Christmas, the members of the Beaver Bank –Kinsac Fire Fighters Association which is composed of current and former members of the fire department partnered with

Beacon House in Lower Sackville to help out those in our community who needed a little extra to make it through the season. This past Christmas we were once again able to make a sizable food donation to the food bank. The members also played Santa Claus and provided a Christmas to a family that needed a little helping hand.

As we finally move towards Spring and into Summer, The department will be busy preparing for some events that will be coming up this year. On Canada Day, as part of the Canada 150 celebrations, the community will be opening the time capsule that is located in the cenotaph

next to the fire station. To celebrate this event the fire department we will be hosting an open house on Canada Day and participating in the opening and resealing of the time capsule which was placed there 25 years ago. We look forward to seeing you during the planned festivities.

On behalf of the volunteers that make up your fire department, I want to thank the community we serve for supporting your local fire department and its members; together our community grows stronger.

Earlier this month, I made an exciting announcement for funding to the Nova Scotia Health Authority (NSHA) on behalf of the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency. The Government will be investing \$2.8 million over five years to allow the NSHA to build an endoscope prototype for medical research.

I also announced, with provincial and municipal representatives, the funding of the Aerotech Connector project that will connect Fall River and Wellington to the Aerotech business park located at the Halifax International Airport.

Finally I would like to talk about the Town Hall I held this past month at the East Preston Recreation Centre. The subject of this Town Hall was affordable housing and we brought in a number of experts to talk with the people on the subject. It was a very successful meeting and we had representatives there from all levels of Government.

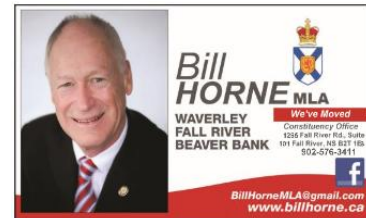

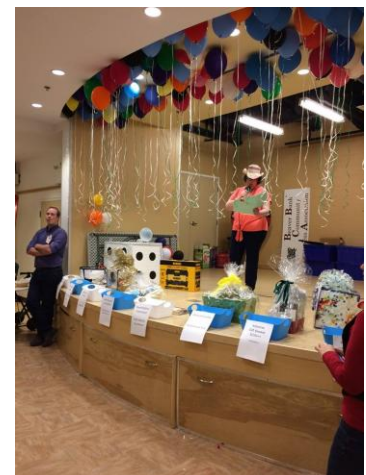

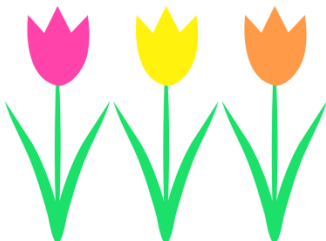
