

Update from Station 48 – Summer is Getting Close – Are You Ready?

The Beaver Bank – Kinsac Volunteer Fire Department continues to keep busy with training, responding to emergencies and fire prevention activities. 2017 is keeping us very busy within our community.

Since the last submission to the bulletin, the department has responded to 27 pages for assistance; 18 medical assists, 1 alarm activation, 2 structure fires (mutual aid), 2 brush fires, 3 motor vehicle accidents, and 1 minor fire. This brings our total number of call outs to 54.

Now that the snow is finally gone and summer is trying to make an appearance, the members of the fire department would like to pass along from friendly safety tips.

With the nicer weather, more people will be hitting the road, whether it is in a vehicle, on a motorcycle, riding a bicycle, jogging or walking. Keep an eye out for each other and give everybody a little extra space by sharing the road. It also won't be long that the school season will be finished for another year and kids will be out and about enjoying their summer holidays so keep an extra eye out. As always, please don't drink and drive.

We are officially in the open air burning season for 2017.

Your fire department would like to thank everyone for continuing to burn responsibly. It is important for those who are allowed to burn to know that there is no burning from midnight until 2 PM. At 2 PM you must check the DNR website

https://novascotia.ca/burnsa fe/ and if it is GREEN, you can burn from 2 PM until midnight. If it is YELLOW, you can burn from 7 PM until midnight. If it is RED, no burning is permitted which includes campfires. Under extreme conditions at any time, DNR or the municipality can implement a ban on burning. If you are unsure if you can or cannot burn, please visit the fire station on a Tuesday night between 7PM and 8 PM and we will be happy to answer your questions. You can also check out www.halifax.ca/fire and click the "Burning Rule & Regulations" for more information.

As we are now into June, we are now into Hurricane Season for 2017. In previous articles, it has been mentioned that everyone should have a home emergency kit that is capable of sustaining them for 72 hours. Take the time to go through your kit at home and refresh any items such as batteries so that if the time comes that you need to use your home preparedness kit, everything will be good to

go. If you don't have an emergency kit and would like more information on making one, check out the Province of Nova Scotia EMO office website at https://novascotia.ca/dma/emo/. It also has really good tips for residents for when an emergency can occur.

On Canada Day, as part of the Canada 150 celebrations, the community will be opening the time capsule that is located in the cenotaph next to the fire station. To celebrate this event, the fire department will be hosting an open house on Canada Day and participating in the opening and resealing of the time capsule which was placed there 25 years ago. We look forward to seeing you during the planned festivities.

On behalf of the volunteers that make up your fire department, I want to thank the community we serve for supporting your local fire department and its members; together our community grows stronger.

Message from Lisa Blackburn

Happy spring in Beaver Bank!

It's a busy time of year in the community with many events and things to do. The annual Low Income Transit Program will begin July 2017 and will accept up to 1,000 qualified applicants. The intent of the program is to make monthly transit passes more affordable for low income residents - participants in the program will be able to purchase monthly adult transit passes for 50% off the regular price.

The <u>application form</u> is now available at <u>www.halifax.ca</u> and can be dropped off at municipal Customer Service Centres, including the location at the Sackville Library.

Spring can also mean cleaning up after a winter of dirt and debris.

A substantial street cleaning program takes place each year to wash away remaining salt and brine, and to ensure the streets are kept reasonably clear of debris for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians. As a preventative measure, the program also helps decrease the amount of debris and sediment entering the storm drain system. Crews are out now doing this work.

On your property, leaf and yard waste can be placed in the green bin, but no grass clippings. Any excess leaf and yard waste can be placed in large paper bags - not plastic - for curbside organics collection.

Municipal and contracted crews will also be out in the coming weeks repairing damage caused by snow-clearing equipment this past winter. Please report turf, curb, or other damage sustained from snow clearing operations to 311 or contact@halifax.ca.

Many residents are wondering too about street paving this summer. HRM will be sending letters out in the coming weeks to let you know what work to expect. As a sneak preview, the following Beaver Bank streets are on the list for this summer (weather permitting):


