

# Update from Station 48 - Kids are back at School & Fall is in the air

The Beaver Bank - Kinsac Volunteer Fire Department continues to keep busy with training and responding to emergencies within our beautiful community. Fire Prevention Week (October 7th to October 13th) is quickly coming up in early October and the members of the fire department will be out in the community visiting local schools and organisations to spread the word on fire prevention. The theme this year is "Look. Listen, Learn, Be Aware, -Fire Can Happen Anywhere". We recommend that all homes have a dedicated escape plan and a meeting place in the event of a fire emergency in your home. This time of year is a good time to practice this plan with the family to make sure everyone knows what to do, where to meet, and that the plan actually works in the event a fire should occur.

Since the last edition of the bulletin, the fire department has responded to 36 pages for assistance; 17 medical assists, 6 alarm activations, 1 structure fire (our response area), 2 structure fires (mutual aid), 3 illegal burns, 4 motor vehicle accidents, 1 special service call, 1 car fire, and 1 investigation call. This brings our total number of call outs so far for the year to 129.

Your local fire department would like to pass along a

friendly reminder to drivers when you are passing emergency scenes where we are operating. There has been a lot of media coverage of the "*Move Over Law*" in Nova Scotia lately and with the volume of traffic on the roads, it poses a safety risk to our members who are working along the roadways.



Motorists are reminded that as you approach an emergency vehicle on the side of the road with its emergency lights flashing to slow down and proceed with caution as you pass by. Working together we can do our best to make the area safe for the firefighters, paramedics, police and other responders so that everyone gets to go home.

As we move into Fall – the evening daylight starts getting shorter and nights are cooler – at some point the old furnace or woodstove will get put back into service to take the chill out of the air at home.

Before you flash up the furnace or woodstove for

the first time, complete a nice thorough inspection to make sure everything is in good working order whether it is done by yourself or a certified person. For woodstoves, check the chimney and if you haven't done so since last Spring – give it a good cleaning and be ready for the home heating season.

On a final note, the Beaver **Bank Awareness** Association continues to partner with the fire department in order to provide free civic signs to residents in order to help first responders find you in the time of an emergency. For those who need a new or replacement civic sign, you can stop by the fire station on a Tuesday night from 7 PM to 8PM or during the day visit the Beaver Bank Community Hub in the community center. I encourage anyone who does not have a one of these high visibility civic signs to drop by and take advantage of this wonderful opportunity.

On behalf of the volunteers that make up your fire department, I want to thank the community we serve for supporting your local fire department and its members; together our community grows stronger. Until next time – stay and play safe.

# **Bill's Blog**

### Changes to the Senior Citizens Property Tax Rebate

This program provides eligible homeowners with a 50% rebate of the actual residential municipal property taxes paid the previous year, up to a maximum of \$800.00 per year. The rebate is always based on the property taxes paid in the previous year. Eligibility criteria is being expanded to allow a rebate to include seniors who move out of their primary residence but have paid the previous year's municipal taxes. With this change, up to 150 more people could be eligible for a rebate. All applications must be postmarked by December 31, 2018. You must provide proof that you received or were eligible to receive the GIS or Allowance and that your property taxes were paid in full. ### <u>Changes to the</u> <u>Residential Tenancies</u> Act

Amendments to the Residential Tenancies Act were introduced that will benefit both tenants and landlords. The goal is to make the act more inclusive, accessible and balanced for tenants and landlords.


 tenants and landlords will have

- alternate ways to serve documents, such as electronically, in addition to only through personal service or registered mail
- reduces the minimum timeframe landlords are required to store abandoned property from 60 days to 30 days
- currently, new homebuyers who do not wish to be landlords may only make an application to evict a tenant after a home is purchased and in their possession. The proposed changes allow the seller to initiate the eviction upon proof of sale
- allows tenants to give notice to change their yearly tenancy to month-tomonth instead of asking for a landlord's permission
- provides landlords with entry times to show an apartment to a prospective tenant or purchaser where there is a fixed-term lease in place
- Terminating of a lease the next month after a single tenant dies to eliminate

We would like to remind anyone out riding of a few things.

1.If you have room in your ATV, backpack or whatever to bring it into the woods, you have room to bring it back out of the wood.

2.Stay on the trail!! If you are out enjoying the trails, please stay on them, please

stay out of the ditches on any gravel ditched road, if the drainage gets damaged it will potentially wash out the road.

- 3.No driving around gates. If the gate is locked and you don't have a key, you don't belong back there!
- 4.Speed The speed limit on any of the roads on Barrett Lands is 20 km/h
- 5. When the locks are changed there is no access to Barrett Lands. This happens each spring when the province puts the spring weight restrictions on the roads.
- 6.To access any Barrett Lands you require both an ATVANS sticker and a BLC sticker visible on your bike.






