

Update from Station 48 – Summer is here, be safe out there

Your fire department continues to be busy training and responding to calls within our community. Since the last update for the Bulletin we have responded to 26 pages for assistance; 19 medical assists, 2 alarm activations, 2 illegal burns, 1 motor vehicle accident, 1 mutual aid structure fire, and 1 tree/power pole/wires fire. This brings our total to 86 calls so far this year.

The fire department celebrated its 54th year of service to the community with our annual banquet just recently and we would like to take some time to recognise some achievements by members of the fire department during the past year.

In recognition for years of service for those that continue to actively serve with the fire department and with our fire fighter's association, we would like to note the following:

Gord West – Our former Fire Chief and now District Chief with HRM Fire – we recognised his continued service with the Beaver Bank – Kinsac Fire Fighters Association – 40 years of dedicated service.

We also have departmental awards for *Fire Fighter of the Year* and *Rookie of the Year*, both awarded to members within our department. Our "Rookie of the Year" award was awarded to rookie fire fighter Perri-Ann Wyatt. Our highest award is "Fire Fighter of the Year" which for this year went to Ken Tweddle.

The fire department are pleased to congratulate and welcome into the fire department family Cara Stymest who recently successfully completed her Volunteer Recruit Training program. As well we had a fire fighter move into the area, Mr Robert A. Schwartz with previous volunteer fire fighting experience in HRM. They and have joined our ranks to continue the legacy of the volunteer fire department serving within our community.

Our cool Spring has finally worked its way into Summer and the above normal temperatures have definitely been a challenge. The members of the fire department would like everyone recognize the signs and symptoms of three different heat emergencies: heat stroke, heat exhaustion, and heat cramps. We have included some tips to help beat the heat and prevent a heat

emergency from occurring to you or your family members.



- Know how to recognize the three most common types of heat-related illness: heat stroke, heat exhaustion, and heat cramps.

- As first aid for a heat stroke, call 9-1-1 immediately. Wrap damp sheets around the victim and start fanning them. Wrap cold packs in a cloth and place them on the victim's wrists and ankles, in the armpits and on the neck. Caution: Prolonged cold after temperature has been reduced may cause hypothermia.
- Victims of heat exhaustion will have a normal temperature, but will have other symptoms: cool, moist, pale skin; heavy sweating; headache, nausea or vomiting and dizziness.
- Heat cramps are muscular pains and spasms that result from intense exertion. Cramps most often attack the abdomen and legs.
- To avoid heat-related illnesses:
 - · Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing.
 - Drink plenty of water.
 - Take regular breaks.
 Eat small meals.

School is out and more and more people are getting out in their backyards, gardening, relaxing, opening up their pools, and heading out on the road for summertime activities or vacation. I would like to take a quick moment to pass along a few safety tips so that we can have a safe summer. If you have a pool, please do not leave young children unsupervised, it only takes a moment of inattention for a tragedy to occur. For the motoring public, please drive safely as children are out of school and on the go. Also be aware of our motorcycle friends on the road as sometimes they are harder to see than a larger vehicle and most importantly, please do not drink and drive. As first responders,

unfortunately we see on a regular basis the tragedy that can occur on the roads in our community and we want everyone to get home safe.

From our fire department family to yours, we wish everyone a safe summer.

Make a lasting Impact! Be an Early Childhood Educator in Nova Scotia

A career in early childhood education provides a range of opportunities to work with young children from birth to 12 years of age, and their families.

As an early childhood educator some of the places you can work include a regulated childcare or pre-primary program, a family home day care agency or an early intervention program supporting families and children. Your career could also lead to training the next generation of early childhood educators as an instructor in an ECE training program or to a position with the provincial government supporting children and youth programs. And more!

You can train at one of our recognized post-secondary institutions. You can take a 2-year diploma program, or a 4-year degree program.

Training is available in French through the Université Sainte-Anne. Mi'kmaq students may also train in a Mi'kmaw environment that reflects their language and culture through the Nova Scotia Community College in Wagmatcook.

Whether you're new to early childhood education or want to upgrade your skills, there
