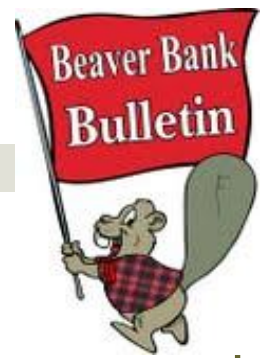

## Update from Station 48 – Welcome to 2018

The Beaver Bank – Kinsac Volunteer Fire Department continues to keep busy responding to emergency calls, training on Tuesday nights, and getting out visiting within our beautiful community.

The call outs for emergency responses continue to keep us busy. Your fire department has responded to 26 pages for assistance since the last edition of the bulletin. We have responded to 18 medical assists, 2 alarm activations, 2 structure fire (mutual aid), 2 motor vehicle accidents, 1 chimney fire, and 1 investigation call. We ended the year of 2017 with 152 calls for assistance and since starting the New Year, we are already at 8 page outs.

The start to 2018 has been a wild weather ride, with extreme cold temperatures in December and then the wild warm and windy spells in January; we would like to remind our residents about ice safety on the ponds and lakes we have in our backyards. With the earlier cold weather, the lakes and ponds became meeting points for ice skating parties and a few games of pick up hockey. However, with the warm weather spells that have occurred recently and the rain we received the last couple of weeks, we urge caution before venturing back out on the ice. The Halifax municipality has a program in place to check

the ice thickness of some of the ponds in our area (Barrett Pond and Tucker Lake) and posts the thickness levels on the HRM website. The fire department would like to remind all residents to check the thickness of the ice before you head out on it to make sure it is safe to hold you and the activity you are participating in. A general guide is 15cm of ice for walking or skating alone, 20 cm of ice for a skating party or games, and 25 cm for a snowmobile or ATV.



As always, if you suspect the ice is not safe, then please stay off the ice.

Even though we have not received much snow so far this season, winter is far from over and you never know when the next blizzard or snow event is around the corner. The fire



department would like residents who live in areas where there are fire hydrants, if you could adopt the fire hydrant next to your property for the winter season and keep it clear of ice and snow. The ideal cleared out space is about 3 feet around the hydrant and can save precious time in the event we have a fire emergency on your street.

As always, the fire department continues to work with the Beaver Bank – Kinsac Awareness Association to provide free to homeowners in Beaver Bank, the high visibility civics signs for your house. If you want one of these highly desirable signs, you can drop by the fire station on Tuesday nights from 7PM to 8PM and pick one up. If you can't make it during that time, the Community Hub office and the Community Centre will take your information and we will do our best to get the requested civic sign ready as soon as we can.

As always the fire department wants to wish everyone a safe start to 2018 and all the best for the New Year. Until next time – stay and play safe.

## A message from Darrell Samson

January was a busy but exciting month for our riding. It was the first time in our history that a sitting Prime Minister has visited Sackville-Preston-Chezzetcook. Not only was I proud to host Prime Minister Justin Trudeau for a Town Hall in Sackville, I was proud of my constituents and the good but tough questions they asked him. I would like to thank all who attended, my staff, the volunteers and the people at Sackville High School who made the event possible – thank you!

Earlier last month I was pleased to join the Minister of Families, Children and Social Development at St. Joseph's Children Centre to announce a \$35-million bilateral agreement with the province to make child care more accessible for families by creating more than 1,000 new daycare spaces. I am proud that with the federal contribution 550 more children will receive the maximum child-care subsidy because the province can now increase the family income eligibility threshold from \$25,000 to \$35,000. I am proud of this

initiative because more spaces and more subsidies in our riding mean more support for families.

With the leadership of Nancy Smithers, Nova Scotia Organics has been producing organic vitamins, minerals, supplements and snacks for 21 years. Last month, I was happy to tour their facility in Lawrencetown and get behind the scenes of their products. While there, I was proud to hear that through ACOA's Business Development Program, NS Organics has received a \$430,815 repayable contribution to implement a marketing plan to increase their sales to international markets. I am always impressed by the number of businesses in our riding that touch markets and communities around the world. NS Organics is no exception and I wish them all the best going forward.

In the coming weeks I plan to meet with our active seniors groups, volunteer firefighters and of course my youth council. If you or someone you know is between 15-24 years old

and interested in learning more about our riding, please contact our office – it's not too late to join!

Finally, I would like to invite everyone to a community skate on family day!

### **Beaver Bank Community Information Hub**

### **Radon Detectors Available for Loan at Constituency Office**

Radon is a radioactive gas that is formed naturally by the breakdown of uranium. Recent scientific studies have linked an increased risk of developing lung cancer from exposure to radon at levels found inside some homes. Radon cannot be detected by the senses. It has no colour, odour or taste. However, it can be detected with special instruments. The only way to know if you have a radon problem is to test your home.

I have 2 digital radon detectors available at our constituency office for loan at no cost to Waverley-Fall River-Beaver Bank residents. These detectors will be loaned out for 6 week periods – the time it takes to complete the test. The 2 detectors are on loan

now and will be available again early February. If you would like to register your name to loan out one of the 2 detectors, please contact our office at 902-576-3411. Radon detectors are also available for loan in public libraries across Nova Scotia, for purchase from the Lung Association of Nova Scotia or available at local hardware stores (or online). For more information on testing for radon, please check out <https://novascotia.ca/dhw/environmental/radon.asp>.

### **Employment Support Services**

Nova Scotia Works is Nova Scotia's new employment service centre network. All services are free of charge and can be accessed at Opportunity Place, 108 Cobequid Rd., [www.opportunityplace.ca](http://www.opportunityplace.ca), or 902-864-7520.

Staff ensures all Nova Scotians looking for work have the support they need to find a good job and that employers know where to go when they are looking for workers. Services include career counselling, job search services and resources, job coaching, job development, employment workshops, and employer engagement services. Meeting with a Case Manager at a Nova Scotia Works centre is the first step.

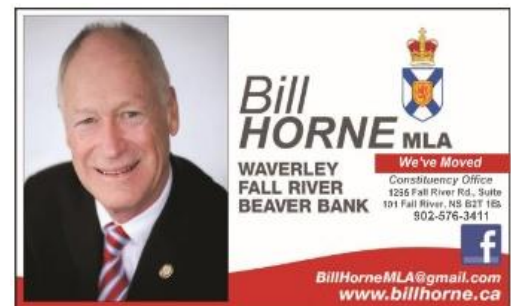

Age 68 of Beaver Bank passed away at home on January 6, 2018. She was the daughter of Eileen and the late Ernest Rhuda of Yarmouth. She will be dearly missed by her husband Cameron, their three sons Timothy, Andrew, and Matthew, their families including 3 wonderful grandchildren Findlay, Eamon and Henry, beloved mother Eileen, dear sister Linda Detienne (Dave) along with nephew David (Jaralin), niece Julie Thoring (Clay) and grand-niece Etta, sister-in-law Lynn Selkirk (Gary) and many nephews on the Starritt side of the family. After being diagnosed with ALS in 2014, she soon became "The ALS Lady" and helped promote awareness through her smiles, joyful disposition and positive attitude. For the past 3 years she had the honour of giving a presentation on her journey with ALS to the 1st year medical students at Dalhousie Univ. Throughout her illness she continued to live a full life, finding and spreading JOY every day. She loved life and shared that love with others through sickness and health. Above all else she loved her family and was especially fond of her 3 grandsons. She will be missed so much by so many, as she lives on in the hearts of those that she loved and that loved her. Words cannot describe the love she has shared with so many spreading joy every day and inspiring so many in a profound way. An angel has returned home.
