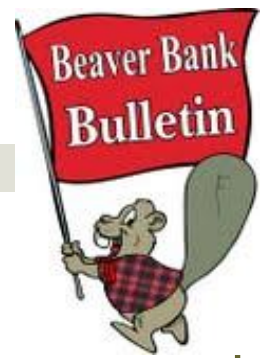

Update from Station 48 – Summer is almost here – are you ready?

The Beaver Bank – Kinsac Volunteer Fire Department continues to keep busy with training, responding to emergencies and fire prevention activities. 2018 is keeping us very busy within our community.

Since the last submission to the bulletin, the department has responded to 35 pages for assistance; 21 medical assists, 3 alarm activations, 2 structure fires (mutual aid), 1 minor fire, 1 motor vehicle accident, 2 illegal burns, 1 chimney fire, 2 investigations, and 2 pole/tree/wires on fire. This brings our total number of call outs to 72.

With the nicer weather, more people will be hitting the road, whether it is in a vehicle, on a motorcycle, riding a bicycle, jogging or walking. Keep an eye out for each other and give everybody a little extra space by sharing the road. It also won't be long that the school season will be finished for another year and kids will be out and about enjoying their summer holidays so keep an extra eye out. As always, please don't drink and drive.

As we are now into June, we are now at the start of the Hurricane Season for 2018. In previous articles, it has been mentioned that everyone should have a home emergency kit that is capable of sustaining them for 72 hours. Take the time to go through your kit at home and refresh any items such as batteries so that if the time comes that you need to use your home

preparedness kit, everything will be good to go. If you don't have an emergency kit and would like more information on making one, check out the Province of Nova Scotia EMO office website at <https://novascotia.ca/dma/em/o/>. This website also has some really good tips for residents for what to do when an emergency occurs.

Since we are starting into summer, the members of your fire department would like to pass along some summertime safety tips for everyone. It won't be long now that people will be looking for ways to beat the summer heat. If you plan to go swimming, whether it is in a backyard pool or in one of our local lakes in order to cool off, never swim alone and if small children may be involved, never leave them unattended. During the summer, drowning deaths increase significantly. If you are a boater and plan to head out on the local lake or the ocean, be prepared as conditions can change quickly with the weather and wind. PFD's are required to be on the boat but we encourage you wear them as it may be too late afterwards.

On a final note, the Beaver Bank Awareness Association continues to work with the fire department in order to provide free civic signs to residents in order to help first responders find you in the time of an emergency. I encourage anyone who does not have a one of these high visibility civic signs to drop by and take advantage of this

wonderful opportunity.

We are very fortunate to have a dedicated group of people within our community that volunteer their time to the fire department. With ongoing training, responding to calls at all hours, and helping within the community, many hours are dedicated by our members to continue to provide the excellent service we strive to maintain. I personally want to thank all past, present, and future members for their continuing effort to serve our fire department and ensure it is ready to help our community when the need arises. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer within the fire department, please drop by the station on a Tuesday evening and we can provide you with all the information about the application process.

We as the fire department also want to thank the community we serve for supporting your local fire department and its members; together our community grows stronger.

Trail Etiquette

We would like to remind anyone out riding of a few things.

1. If you have room in your ATV, backpack or whatever to bring it into the woods, you have room to bring it back out of the wood. Please remember if you pack it in, pack it out.
2. Stay on the trail!! If you are out enjoying the trails, please stay on them, please stay out of the ditches on any gravel ditched road, if the drainage gets damaged it will potentially wash out the road.
3. No driving around gates. If the gate is locked and you don't

have a key, you don't belong back there!

4. Speed – The speed limit on any of the roads on Barrett Lands is 20 km/h
5. When the locks are changed there is no access to Barrett Lands. This happens each spring when the province puts the spring weight restrictions on the roads.
6. To access any Barrett Lands you require both an ATVANS sticker and a BLC sticker visible on your bike.

A message from Darrell Sampson

Dear friends,
June is an exciting and busy month as students and adults alike look forward to the upcoming summer fun. If you or your organization is hosting a special event this summer please contact my office so that we can attend and be a part of your celebration or event.

Last month I had the chance to visit the Lake Major Dam in Cherry Brook with Halifax Water employees. The Lake Major Watershed provides water to Dartmouth, Cole Harbour, Eastern Passage, Westphal and North Preston. The existing dam is over 80 years old, so that is why the federal government invested \$2.2 million towards the Lake Major Dam. We can expect major construction this month and a new dam with a fishway by November 2018! Stay tuned!

This spring our government introduced legislation to modernize the electoral system, making it more accessible, transparent, and secure. Bill C-76, the Elections Modernization Act, will, if passed, result in a generational overhaul of the Canada Elections Act, allowing it to better address the realities facing our democratic institutions in the 21st century. Today, many Canadians currently face barriers in their efforts to participate in federal elections. You may know a loved one that lives abroad but was unable to vote in the last

election, this legislation will restore voting rights to more than one million Canadians who currently live outside of Canada. Although C-76 is a large piece of legislation, the changes proposed address 85% of the Chief Electoral Officer's recommendations following the 2015 election.

On June 4th I will be hosting an information session at my office in Fall River for the New Horizons for Seniors Program, all are welcomed to attend. Organizations are invited to apply for funding for projects that empower seniors to initiate and participate in activities that benefit the community. Eligible projects include activities and programming by seniors and for seniors. Funding can cover the costs of professional services, contractors, honoraria, travel expenses for volunteering and employment related costs...etc. Eligible organizations can receive up to \$25,000 in project funding. Starting this year, organizations that have not benefitted from NHSP funding during the last five years can receive up to \$5,000 as part of the new small grants pilot project. The small grants are perfect for organizations with little administrative capacity. Our seniors make significant and valuable contributions to their families, communities and society. Programs like NHSP not only encourage seniors to stay involved in their community, which is key to enhance their health, well-being and quality of life, but help them stay active and share their knowledge, skills and experience with others.

Applications close June 15, so please call my office for more information.

An early congratulations to all of our 2018 high school graduates as well! This year I will be attending the Sackville, Lockview and Cole Harbour High graduation ceremonies. Best of luck as you embark on new opportunities this fall. In addition, good luck to the 219 students in Sackville-Preston-Chezzetcook working Canada Summer Jobs next month! I look forward to visiting you all this summer.

The province is committed to improving mental health care for Nova Scotians. Health and Wellness is working with partners across health care and communities to improve mental health services. This work is done through the department's Mental Health, Children's, Services, and Addiction Treatment branch.

You may refer yourself to Mental Health and Addictions services (please note: some services may require referral from a physician). The intake clinicians will ask questions to help determine the

services you need. The intake call may take 15 to 20 minutes and you will be asked for your Health Card number.

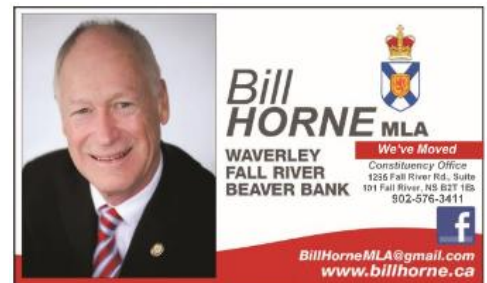

2nd Beaver Bank "A" Colony



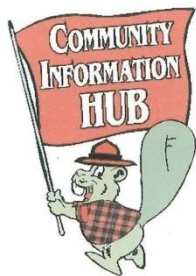
